Summary of Work: The Diabetes RN Case Manager is a health care professional engaged in teaching individuals with diabetes (and their families) how to self manage their condition by providing a fund of knowledge to the patient, utilizing the Core Curriculum for Diabetes, the Diabetes Standard of Care, and I.H.S. Best Practices for Diabetes. The Incumbent will develop a holistic comprehensive nursing care plan utilizing cultural values, preventative health measures, and nursing care standards to meet the unique needs of the individuals with diabetes on the Northern Cheyenne Reservation.

Job Characteristics:

Nature of Work: This position provided diabetes education, activities and care for individuals with diabetes and/or their family. This position performs skilled nursing

duties in provision of diabetes care, prevention of diabetes, and health promotion for individuals, families, and communities.

Development of educational care plans including setting specific goals and objectives based on individual assessment of needs.

Implementation of educational care plan based on the established principles of teaching-learning theory and lifestyle counseling.

Performance of follow up evaluations to assess understanding and utilizations of diabetes self-management skills and knowledge including reassessment of needs.

Proper documentation of all educational encounters through the RPMS system.

Personal Contacts: Daily contact with individuals or groups, medical and clinical staff, and health care programs in order to coordinate referrals and resources. Coordinates activities and services with other health care professionals and programs.

Clinical and Administrative Supervision Received: Receives clinical direction through referrals from the Diabetes Coordinator and consultation from the patient's primary provider. Follows written policies and procedures of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe.

Essential Functions: Requires ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing, interpret pertinent clinical data, record data, plan, follow-up and respond to referrals, network with other health care programs and work as a Diabetes Team member, prepare and present educational materials.

Areas of Job Accountability and Performance:

Collaborates with members of the multidisciplinary team in assessing, planning, Implementing, and evaluating health care delivery.

Provided patient education to promote healthy lifestyle and prevent and/or delay the onset of complications of diabetes. Describe the diabetes disease process and treatment options, incorporate the Healthy Plate program for meal planning, and incorporate physical activity into lifestyle.

Educate on use of glucose meters and using results to improve control.

Educate on use medications for therapeutic effectiveness.
