The Northern Cheyenne Tribe (NCT) is now accepting sealed bids for a Professional Nutritional Services for the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Board of Health to provide Nutritional Services for the Board of Health Program to be located within the Northern Cheyenne community in Southeastern Montana.

Purposes:

The Northern Cheyenne Tribal Board of Health Department is seeking Professional Nutritional Services for the NCTBH Wellness (Diabetes) Program.

Scope of Work:

1. Contractor must furnish all labor and materials for the Professional Certified Nutritional Services for a 4-month period that will include dietetic services, diabetes prevention tools along with counseling to individuals and various sized groups.
2. Contractor to work on-site at the NCTBH Wellness Building located in Lame Deer, Montana.
3. Provide clinical consultation, educational presentations and handouts on the Healthy Plate Program.
4. Development of policies and procedures for ongoing services resulting from consultation.
5. Patient and clinic record data entering and auditing.
6. Provide additional duties as assigned by Diabetes (Wellness) Coordinator that have been referred by the primary care provider or medical staff.
7. All duties will utilize the approved Standard by the American Dietetic Association and the Indian Health Services Standards for care for Diabetes.
8. Should include detailed billing for hourly fees and other applicable expenditures.
9. Submit and provide qualifying credentials.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

INDIAN PREFERENCE. The owner will factor Indian preference into the bid analysis process however it will in no case be the sole deciding factor in awarding work. Evidence of eligibility for Indian preference must be submitted with the proposal. Responsible bids will be accepted from Non-Indian owned contractors. In evaluation of the bids, the Tribe may, within funding limitations, give preference in the amount of 5% above the lowest total bid, to qualified Indian owned firms.

TERO. Each contractor is required to be certified by the Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO) prior to submitting a bid in accordance with the Northern Cheyenne TERO Ordinance. The contractor is required to comply with the requirements of the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Employment Rights Office.
